



- Significant presence of the private sector in the public goods provision



Different Trajectories Active Number of Cases, Philippines and Malaysia










The plot of New Cases (Malaysia) for Dates Day. Color shows details about New Cases (Malaysia).



Regulation and Enforcement

Directives by National Security Council (NSC)



- "to formulate policies and strategic measures on national security, including sovereignty, territorial integrity, defence, socio-political stability, economic stability, strategic resources, antional unity and other interets relating to national security;"
- "Any member of the Security Forces may, without warrant, arrest any person found committing, alleged to have committed or reasonably suspected of having committed any offence under any written laws in the security area."



Electricity bill discounts, ranging from 15-50% (depends on the usage)

Free internet services during MCO

RM 100 billion into food storage and distribution upgrading

Wage Subsidy Program

RM600/m for three months to every employee earning less than RM4,000, with employers experiencing more than 50% decrease in their income since January 2020. **Employers must ensure there are no retrenchments.**

Estimated to benefit 3.3million workers with an allocation of RM 5.9billion.




